At the beginning of this year, I wrote about how doing things for others, and volunteer work is according to research a way people ensure their mental

wellbeing is positive into the later years of life. We challeng our students every day to be positive and caring members of our school and the wider community. Two students from North Nowra Public School, Boudeeka and Teisha-Lee from Year 6 have taken this up in 2017. Early in the year, they approached me about putting together care packs for women in the Shoalhaven. It was recommended that they do this as a personal project and the school community could support through donations and fundraising. So off they went and set about developing the project.

This week the project reached its conclusion and the students delivered 124 care packages to the Shoalhaven Homeless Hub, an amazing effort. I thank Boudeeka and Teisha-Lee for their tenacity to ensure the goal of the project was achieved, their parents for supporting and seeing the project through and our communities' support in bringing the resources together. Knowing about any other student coming to school in 2018 is appreciated. Recommendation: - Please call the office and inform them of your families' intention to leave the school.

PBL Values for Bike Track Guide

Be Safe

- Wear a helmet when riding a bike on track
- Walk bike at all other times in the school
- Go the one way on track (clockwise)

Be Responsible

- Report problems at the right time
- Start and finish riding at the right spot on the track (near playground equipment)

Be Respectful

- Support less skilled riders to enjoy the track (look after the younger students)
- Follow teachers' directions immediately

PBL Bike Track Consequences

Positive behaviour rewards (but not limited to);

- Permission to use the bike track
- Kooka tickets/positive verbal praise
- Merit awards

Negative behaviour consequences

- Riding bike without helmet no riding on track for one session
- Riding bike in school (not on bike track) no riding on track one session
- Not following teacher directions no riding on track one session

Repeated Disobedience

Repeated failures to follow the PBL Values, with be seen as 'repeated disobedience' and will result in the regular PBL Consequence system for playground being applied. Consequences could include but are not limited to

- Withdrawal from bike track program
- Withdrawal of permission to being bike to school
- Administration of the Welfare and Discipline Guidelines for 'Repeated Disobedience'


School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) 2018 BUS PASSES

Just to let you know that as at next year the BSB number and not branch name will need to be written on deposit slips.

Education & Communities

The last banking day this term will be Thursday December 7th, second last week of term, so all those Bankers eligible to pre-order with 9 tokens or order rewards with 10 tokens need to get their requests in soon. Some of our students have 10 tokens but do not bank regularly. Don't be a stranger. We can organise a new deposit book for you and you can order your rewards at the same time.

Certificates will be going out to our regular and consistent savers soon. They will be delivered via canteen class baskets along with returning bank books. Congratulations to those families who have made the effort to keep banking at school. Recognition goes to the children who have been banking their pocket money from doing chores at home or for others. Each new student to participate in School Banking and every amount deposited earns a commission paid by the Commonwealth Bank that goes to the P&C Association of our school to help out with fundraising for specific facilities or items that benefit the school or to help fund other P&C run operations that in turn offer a service, such as the canteen. No money comes out of your deposits. It comes separately from the Commonwealth Bank as an incentive for schools to run School Banking and as a way to give financial education through their programs.

A special thank you goes out to the ladies that volunteer their time at the canteen each Thursday who assist me in a variety of ways that make my job of School Banking Co-ordinator easier.
